





The importance of keywords.

Use keywords from the job post.
They help you get found online and through Applicant Tracking Systems.




What is an Applicant Tracking System?

This software scans resumes and cover letters for relevant experience, skills and other keywords so that qualified candidates are easy for employers to identify.

How to write a headline or summary.

A headline is the shortest version: sum up your achievements in one line.

In a summary or objective statement, you can get a little longer: one or two sentences is typically a good length.



Headline and summary examples.

Headline

Certified dental assistant with 12+ years in direct patient care.

Summary

Extensive experience in charting, scheduling and delivering best in class customer service. Vast knowledge of clinical procedure and dental terminology. Looking for new opportunities in private dental practice.



How to write about your experience.

- 1. Use bullet points, not paragraphs.
- 2. Lead with strong action verbs, follow with an accomplishment rather than task.
- 3. Include more details about your most recent experience and fewer details from earlier roles.
- 4. Find common job titles that connect to the career path you're applying for and relate to your own experience.



Add quantifiable results. For example, a retail sales associate might say, "Regularly evaluated showroom inventory and refreshed displays with stock, increasing daily sales by 22%."

How to talk about your education.

If you're currently in a program of study, you can list the degree you're pursuing and your expected graduation date. If you're still in school and applying for internships, potential employers may want to know your GPA.







